Transgender

Queer/Questining

An umbrella term which embraces a variety of sexual preferences, orientations, habits of those who do not adhere to the heterosexual and cisgender majority.

The term queer includes, but is not exclusive to lesbians, gay men, bisexuals, transpeople, and intersex persons, traditionally, this term is derogatory and hurtful, however, many people who do not adhere to sexual and/or gender norms use it to identify in a positive way.

The Genderbread Person v3.3 by its pronounced METROsexual

Gender is one of those things everyone thinks they understand, but most people don't. Like recursion. Gender isn't binary. It's not either/or. In many cases it's both/and. A bit of this, a dash of that. This easy little guide is meant to be an appetizer for gender understanding. It's okay if you're hungry for more, in fact, that's the idea.

Put a point on both continua in each category to represent your identity (combine all responses to form your Genderbread). A set of ratings (gender, sex, and other markers).

How you, in your head, define your gender; based on how much you align (or don't align) with what you understand to be the options for gender.

How you present gender through your actions, dress, and demeanor; and how those presentations are interpreted based on gender norms.

The physical sex characteristics you're born with and through, including genitalia, body shape, voice pitch, body hair, hormones, chromosomes, etc.

Who you're sexually attracted to (None/Neither/Feminine/Male/Both)

Who you're romantically attracted to (None/Neither/Feminine/Male/Both)

Inter sex/Asexual/Androgen

Asexual – A person who is not attracted to anyone, or a person who does not have a sexual orientation.

Androgen - a person who can easily swift between genders being not any of them, has no specific gender.
